

Happy February! Our themes for this month will include winter, friendship and bears.

<u>Language arts:</u> we will continue to focus on various winter stories and work on how to retell a story as well as learning how to sequence the events of the stories. We've been taking an in depth look at <u>The Mitten</u> story and we will continue on with helping students develop their retelling skills. This is an important skill in becoming a strong reader. We are continuing to work on learning letter recognition and also the sounds of the alphabet and working in our Jolly Phonics books on our printing skills.

<u>Math - We are continuing to work on number recognition(building, drawing, and printing numbers from 0 to 10)</u>. The kids will continue subitizing numbers 1-5 and will eventually move towards 6-10. Subitizing means being able to recognize numbers at a glance without counting.

<u>Social Studies - We will continue on our 'Me' Unit and what makes us unique.</u>

<u>Science</u> - We will continue investigating our <u>Five Senses</u> (see, taste, smell, touch, hear).

Learning More in 3 and 4!

Language Arts: We are moving into our non-fiction unit. Students are looking at asking and answering questions, features of non-fiction text such as glossaries and captions, and finding the best information. In grammar we are looking at subject/verb and noun/pronoun agreement.



Math: We are moving on the division. Grade 3's will be looking at splitting things evenly between groups and basic division facts related to multiplication facts up to 5x5. Grade 4's will be looking at basic division facts related to multiplication facts up to 9x9, as well as beginning long division.



Social Studies: We are looking at the history of Alberta, beginning with our First Nations, and through immigration from Europe and the fur trade.

Science: We are exploring Newtons's laws of motion, and how we can change the amount and direction of forces to make work easier.
