On April 8, 2024, a partial solar eclipse will be visible, between 11:38 am and 1:45 pm.

It is not safe to look at a partial solar eclipse without safety precautions to protect eyesight. More safety information can be found on the NASA website.

During the time of eclipse, we will have a supervised indoor recess, where students will be invited to stay away from the windows. Teachers will be taking advantage of this learning opportunity and have students view the eclipse in classrooms via a live stream.

For a bit of fun on Monday, we will have a "Wear your Shades to School " day as we take in the solar eclipse via live stream in classrooms.

Oher News:
The Alberta Government announced last week that Provincial Achievement Exams for Grade 6 and 9 - Math and ELA only - will be postponed this year in light of implementation of new curriculum. This is good news for students, who are currently in the process of making adjustments to new learning outcomes at their grade level, particularly in math.

## Ms. Tetzlaff's Kindergarten Class

Language Arts: We will continue to work in our printing books, learning the letters/sounds associated with the alphabet as well as continuing to learn about rhyming. Typically by the end of our kindergarten year your child should be able to recognize and generate rhyming words. Children who learn to recognize and generate rhymes have a better understanding of word families and are more successful at reading. To help with this at home: sing rhyming songs, expose your child to nursery rhymes, and read stories (ex. Dr. Seuss books).

Numeracy: The kindergarten students are working on number sense through counting, recognizing, printing, sorting and making sets with numbers $0-10$. For the next few months students will be learning about money. We will have students explore and communicate that money has features to represent its value.

Social Studies: We will continue learning about "My Community" as well as learning ways they can care for the Earth as well as the concepts of reduce, reuse and recycle.

With the warmer weather and snow melting....we have puddles and wet playground areas. Please ensure your child brings rain pants or protective clothing to keep them from getting wet outside during recess.

## Ms. Machell \& Ms. Tetzlaff's Grade 1 \& 2

Welcome to April! Spring is finally here and the air is buzzing with the energy!
Language Arts: We will be working on a variety of different activities to continue to develop reading and writing skills. Teaching students at a young age to write improves their reading skills by helping them recognize the connection between the letters they see and the sounds the letters make. Our students will continue to work on fluency skills(pace, expression) as they build their confidence as readers. It has been so wonderful to read with our students and see the progress that is being made.

Math: We are continuing to strengthen our knowledge and understanding around addition and subtraction facts. Grade 1's are continuing to learn the basic addition and subtraction facts to 20 and building on their understanding of numbers 1-100. Grade 2's will continue to practice adding/subtraction skills with/without regrouping. Both grades will continue to practice skip counting skills moving forward and backwards.

Social Studies: We will be finishing our unit on how we belong in our community.

Science We are working on the Light portion of our unit on Energy.
